

Business Benefit of the Proof of Concept

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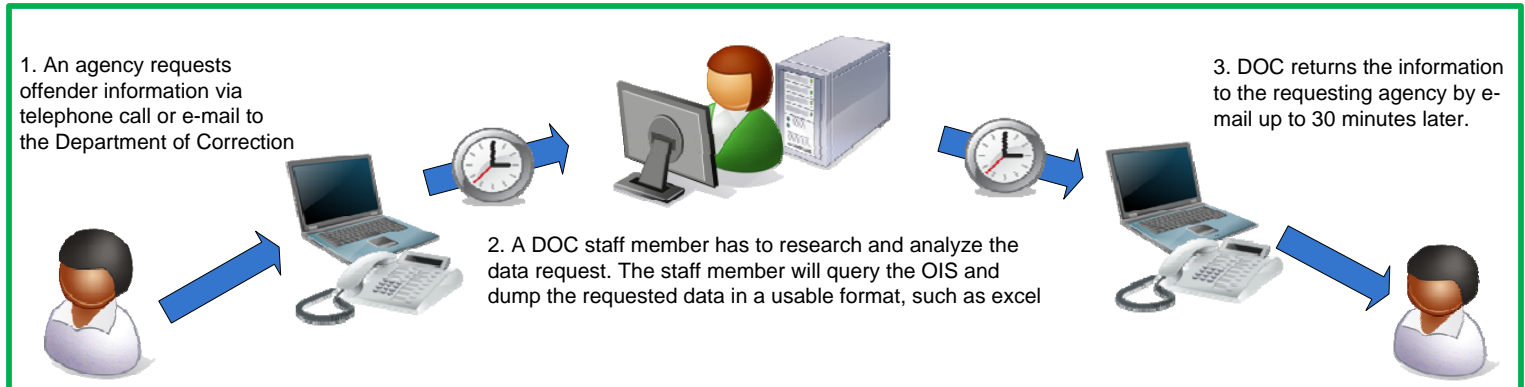
With the receipt of the remaining web services over the past few weeks, final development of the proof of concept is underway. As discussed in the strategic plan, most of the partner agencies indicated they would realize enhanced or streamlined business processes by receiving information through IDEX.

Building out the proof of concept is the first step to enable information sharing between justice and public safety systems. It is important to note that the proof of concept will leverage national information sharing standards to link existing information systems, providing a common language with which they can communicate. This will maximize the benefit to the State, and also allow for continual connection to the information sharing architecture.

Current Process Example: DOC-CRM

As part of the proof of concept implementation, agencies have the potential to gain portal access to offender information and offender status updates from the IDOC-CRM system.

Benefits of DOC-CRM Portal Access

By giving agencies portal access, the process can be eliminated. Authorized agency personnel can sign-in to the portal and query an individual of interest to access offender information records housed in the DOC-CRM system. By streamlining this process, the following benefits may result:

- Agencies needing access to offender records will be able to receive them almost instantaneously, resulting in enhanced decision making within the system
- DOC personnel will no longer have to invest their time querying simple identifying data from the system; rather, they will be able to assist in more sophisticated analyses
